## Visitation Schedule:

The Non-Custodial Parent shall have visitation rights with the child(ren) as follows, unless otherwise mutually agreed in writing or ordered by the court: 1. Weekly Visitation: Every [day(s) of the week] from [start time] to [end time]. 2. Alternate Weekends: From Friday at [start time] to Sunday at [end time] every other weekend. 3. Holidays: The parties shall alternate major holidays annually, including but not limited to New Year's Day, Easter, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. Specific holiday schedule shall be attached as Schedule A. 4. School Breaks: The Non-Custodial Parent shall have visitation during school vacations, including spring break and summer vacation, with dates to be agreed upon at least 30 days in advance. 5. Other: Additional visitation may be exercised by mutual consent.

## Transportation Responsibilities:

The parties agree that transportation arrangements for visitation exchanges shall be as follows: - The Non-Custodial Parent shall be responsible for transportation to and from visitation locations unless otherwise agreed. - Both parties shall cooperate to ensure timely exchanges and communicate any changes promptly. - Safety and well-being of the child(ren) during transportation shall be the responsibility of the transporting party.

## Parental Rights and Responsibilities:

Both parents shall share the responsibility and rights as follows: - The Custodial Parent shall make daily decisions regarding the child(ren)'s welfare during custody periods. - The Non-Custodial Parent shall be kept informed of significant matters affecting the child(ren)'s health, education, and welfare. - Both parents shall foster a positive relationship between the child(ren) and the other parent. - Neither parent shall do anything to alienate or harm the relationship between the child(ren) and the other parent.

## Modification and Enforcement:

This Agreement may be modified only by a written document signed by both parties or by court order. Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement may result in enforcement by the court and/or modification of visitation rights.

**Health and Safety:**

Both parents agree to prioritize the health and safety of the child(ren) at all times during visitation. Neither parent shall allow the child(ren) to be exposed to unlawful activities, harmful substances, or unsafe environments during visitation periods.

**Communication:**

The parents shall communicate respectfully and timely regarding visitation schedules, changes, emergencies, and issues affecting the child(ren). Electronic communication (email, text messaging) is acceptable for routine matters.

**Dispute Resolution:**

In the event of a dispute related to this Agreement, the parties agree to first attempt resolution through mediation before seeking court intervention.

**Governing Law:**

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of \_\_\_\_\_, United States of America.

**Entire Agreement:**

This document contains the entire agreement between the parties regarding visitation and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings, and negotiations, whether oral or written.
